SCARLET AND COLOURS AWARDS

1. Bylaws covering the Awards

- 1.1. Only matriculated students who are current members of the NSA will be considered for an award.
- 1.2. Nominations should normally be submitted through the relevant society.
- 1.3. All nominations are considered on an 'individual' basis.

2. Scarlet and Half Scarlet Criteria

SCARLET: consistent and exceptional performance throughout the year, normally culminating in University or Society representation in a Local or National performance

HALF-SCARLET: consistent and outstanding performance at a standard below that of a full Scarlet.

- 2.1. The candidate must have represented his/her society for at least one Semester
- 2.2. If the candidate does not exactly meet the condition stated in "2.1" above the representative for the relevant society must present a case for the candidate.
- 2.3. If the candidate has performed to a high standard at Local or National events, then he/she may be considered for an award.
- 2.4. Re-award: where an individual is being considered for a Scarlet re-award, his/her performance must demonstrate achievement of a higher standard.

3. Colours

A student may be awarded a colour for exceptional service and active involvement in University societies over a period of at least two years. Nominees must be in their 3rd or final year of study.

5. Honorary Scarlet

5.1 Service Award

5.1.1. Individuals who have contributed significantly to student societies at Edinburgh Napier University over a number of years in any capacity may be considered for the award of Honorary Scarlet.

5.1.2. Nominations should normally be made by the appropriate club, but may also be made by the Societies Executive Committee.

5.1.3. The recipient must be able to attend the Annual Awards Ceremony

THE DECISION OF THE AWARDS COMMITTEE IS FINAL. THERE IS NO RIGHT OF APPEAL
